HOW WILL YOU KNOW IF WORLD FEST IS CANCELLED?

We advise that all teachers do one of the following to learn the status of WORLDFEST:

- 1) Log on to www.rcdcworldfest.org
An announcement regarding the status of WORLD FEST will be posted on the site. The announcement will be posted on Friday, September 25th by 6:00 a.m.
- 2) Check your email on Friday, September 25th by 6:00 a.m. You will receive emails from city of Little Rock staff indicating the status of WORLDFEST.
- 3) Call-in to our office at (501) 244-5483.
A voicemail announcement will indicate whether WORLDFEST will continue as planned or whether WORLDFEST will be cancelled.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW IF WORLDFEST CONTINUES AS PLANNED?

We suggest that teachers work out a communication plan with bus drivers in case WORLDFEST ends early due to changing weather conditions.

There will be a designated area for students to “check-in” their sack lunches during the festival. This will allow for students to store their lunches while they enjoy tours and WORLDFEST activities.

We will also have food vendors for those students wanting to purchase their lunches during the event.
